SUBJECT: **INFORMATION RELATING TO STUDENTS' PERFORMANCE FOR SEMESTER ENDED DECEMBER 2016**

I present warm greetings and compliments to you and the entire membership of KSDAA. Furtherance to our recent email exchanges regarding grade sheets information for students who benefited from KSDAA fees & tuition assistance during the Sept/Dec 2016 Academic Semester, I'm pleased to report our findings as presented in **Appendix A** at the end and summarized in the **Table 1** and **Table 2** below:

***Insights from Table 1, Table 2 and Appendix***

- i. A total of 41 students were expected to register for the semester. Of these, 1 did not show up at all, 1 discontinued after registration, and 39 continued to the end of the semester.
- ii. Considering all 41 beneficiaries, the ratio of males to female beneficiaries is 3 to 1, meaning that for every 3 male beneficiaries, there is 1 female;
- iii. The Science & Tech Department and the Divinity Department are yet to record a KSDA student enrolment, whilst the Education Department has no female enrolment.
- iv. for KSDAA, overall academic performance, measured in GPA, is lowest at **1.25**, highest at **4.00** and average at **2.39**.
- v. GPA information is lacking for four (4) students, owing to the following:
  - a. Students enrolled in the enrichment program must first complete the remedial program before being admitted to a mainstream degree coursework for which GPA counts; three (3) students, one of whom did not show up at all, are in the process of completing their remedial requirements;
  - b. one (1) student, enrolled in a mainstream coursework, discontinued classes and consequently got no GPA;

In Table 2 above, this category of students (i.e. in **a** and **b**) is taken into account in the *0.00 – 0.99* GPA range.
- vi. GPA peaked at 3.42 amongst females and 4.00 amongst males, and averaged at 1.89 and 2.55 respectively;
- vii. Based on low GPAs (i.e. less than 2.00), five (5) KSDAA students – all males were served notices of academic probation for the next semester;

Our academic policy further prescribes “suspension” if no improvement is observed in the following/next semester.

- viii. In December 2016, four (4) KSDAA students who completed their courses of study in November 2016 graduated from GGCCC with Associate of Arts (AA) degrees. The graduates include three (3) from the Business & Public Administration Department, and one (1) from the Department of Education.

Today, two (2) of the business graduates, Rose B. Youboty and Neah E. Tardey, are amongst few Grand Geddeans who sat and successfully passed the widely failed recruitment test of the Liberia Bank for Development & Investment (LBDI) which is opening a branch in Zwedru. The two graduates are currently undergoing orientation and training at LBDI’s headquarters in Monrovia for subsequent deployment at the Zwedru Branch of LBDI.

With the foregoing tables, brief analysis, and the datasheet appended, it is our hope and trust that you find this information relevant and very useful in planning, strategizing and tracking progress and challenges for an effective, continued initiative.
